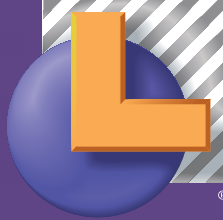

# A Message from the Lottery

**The fiscal year that ended June 30, 1999 was the second highest in sales in the 14-year history of the California Lottery.\* Sales of \$2.49 billion generated \$899 million for public education. That helped bring the Lottery's total contribution to public schools and higher education entities to over \$11 billion by the end of 1999.**

The key to the Lottery's success this year has been the higher payout Scratchers program. Based on a lottery industry "best practice," the program makes more money for schools by giving more to players in the form of prizes and thereby increasing sales. As a result of instituting this program, the California Lottery led the U.S. lottery industry in Scratchers sales growth in 1998.

Scratchers sales were \$955 million for the year, reaching the highest level in 11 years and

surpassing the \$910 million annual goal. This was a 40 percent increase over the first year of higher payouts, which was a 28 percent increase over the previous year. The higher payout Scratchers program is made possible by reductions in the Lottery's administrative budget. Streamlining efforts enabled the Lottery to improve its efficiency and then to re-allocate administrative funds to additional Scratchers prizes. Among the improvements to operational efficiency was a new accounting system, implemented in January 1999, which provides more timely financial information at a lower cost. Another efficiency program is the automated inventory replenishment system, called E-Z Ship, which keeps retailers supplied with an appropriate quantity and mix of Scratchers games. Such programs have permitted the Lottery to cut its administrative budget from the statutory 16 percent of sales to 13.5 percent.

By investing administrative savings in additional Scratchers prizes for the past two years, we were able to grow sales, and thereby made \$44 million more for public schools.

SuperLOTTO sales continued a gradual decline, mirroring the U.S. lottery trend of recent years. An \$87 million jackpot in June, the third largest in California history, boosted the year's SuperLOTTO sales to \$1.03 billion, seven percent below the previous year. Sales of Fantasy 5, Daily 3, Hot Spot and Daily Derby showed little change from the previous year.

Like business organizations worldwide, the Lottery devoted considerable attention to Y2K preparedness. The Lottery began to address the issue in 1996 with a formal Year 2000 Strategic Program that included a thorough inventory, assessment and testing of all hardware and software. Working closely with major gaming, telecommunications and financial systems vendors, the Lottery successfully tested and, where necessary, remediated all mission-critical systems. The result was a smooth, trouble-free transition into the Year 2000 for all California Lottery customers.



Like Governor Gray Davis, the California Lottery makes public education its first, second and third priority. The Lottery's mandate is to provide additional funding to public education, and in fact to maximize the amount of money to schools. One proven way to make more money for schools is to continue and to expand the higher payout Scratchers program. Unfortunately by the end of the 1999-2000 fiscal year, we will reach the limit

under the present system and will not be able to afford further growth in education revenues because we will not have the necessary prize funds. Our challenge in fulfilling our mandate in the new century will be to develop additional sources of prize funds. With the cooperation of our retailers, business partners and public education beneficiaries, the Lottery Commission and staff are committed to meeting that challenge.

# Business Highlights

Scratchers sales have increased steadily since higher prize payouts began in the 1996-1997 fiscal year. Scratchers

SuperLOTTO sales ended the year at \$1.037 billion, five percent below the previous year. This was the third consecutive year of slightly declining SuperLOTTO sales. The \$87 million jackpot in June 1999 was the third largest in California history.

## SUPERLOTTO

The Fantasy 5 game has been a mainstay at the Lottery since February, 1992. Sales for the Fantasy 5 game closed the 1998-1999 fiscal year at \$160.5 million. The 5 of 39 "better odds lotto game" offers players a chance to win a top prize that starts at \$50,000. A

Since its launch in January 1998, Daily Derby has offered players the chance to play their favorite horses as if they were at the racetrack. Players choose three horses out of 12 and also pick the race time. A special Guaranteed \$250,000 Grand Prize Pool promotion that ran in June 1998 boosted sales and gave the players more to play for.

In 1999 the new "Big Spin 2000" television game show received a new host, new game sets and game styles, a new production company located in Los Angeles and a new education segment.

The show introduced TV veteran Pat Finn, who joined long-time co-host Maiquel Alejo. Finn also hosts the Lifetime Channel game show "Shop 'Til You Drop" and was pre-

exciting tone for the show, which is evident in the eye-catching set featuring the largest prize wheel in the world and giving players the chance to win up to \$3 million. The new California Countdown segment also leads players to the wheel, replacing the old California Gold.

The *Big Spin 2000* Scratchers ticket is not the only ticket to win on the *Fame & Fortune* Scratchers

The *Weekly Grand* Scratchers game provides another way for players to win big. *Weekly Grand* winners receive a prize of \$1,000 a week for 20 years, totaling \$1.04 million.

The "Heroes in Education" segment was added to the show to honor volunteers throughout the state who have made extraordinary efforts on their own time to help children succeed

games have evolved considerably over the 14-year history of the California Lottery. In the beginning, only one game was put on sale at a time, with the selection gradually improving to the point that many retailers carry 15 of the over 20 different games available. Sales for the 1998-1999 fiscal year were \$955 million, a 41 percent increase over the previous year.

## HOT SPOT

The Hot Spot game introduced new features to its players this year. Bulls-eye gave the players a new way to play and the chance to win bigger prizes. Hit the Gold was another feature that replaced Bulls-eye in the spring, again allowing players the opportunity to win bigger prizes. Hot Spot sales for the year were \$255.9 million, a slight decline from the previous year.

feature that is popular with players is a coupon generated when \$5 worth of Fantasy 5 plays is purchased at one time on one ticket. The coupon gives players the chance to win a trip to the "Big Spin 2000" show, where they can win up to \$150,000 on the show's "Dream Machine."

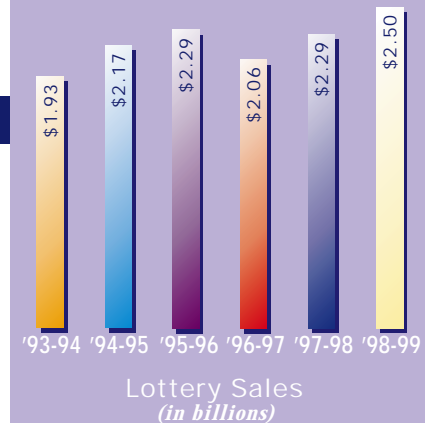

# Winner Profiles

During the 1998-1999 fiscal year, over \$1.6 billion was won by more than 261 million winning tickets from all California Lottery games combined. Of those winners, 119 Californians won all or a portion of a SuperLOTTO jackpot during the year. The "Big Spin 2000" show featured 826 contestants who won more than \$25 million in prizes. Those contestants included seven Weekly Grand winners who won a prize of \$1,000 a week for 20 years. There were also five spinners who won \$1 million or more on the Big Spin wheel.

## THREE "SPINS" WINS

### "Big Spin 2000" Millionaire

Deanna King, a mother of six from Brentwood, came to an abrupt stop while driving when she realized she had scratched off three "SPIN" symbols on her Scratchers ticket and would be a contestant on the "Big Spin 2000" TV show.

King was in the corner store buying her children some candy when she decided to purchase a Scratchers ticket. The winning ticket took King to the "Big Spin 2000". Once on the show, King spun the wheel and won \$1,000,000!

## A RECORD YEAR

### A Year of Records: 3rd and 4th Biggest SuperLOTTO Jackpots and Largest Individual Winner

The California Lottery kicked off the 1998-1999 fiscal year with a \$70 million SuperLOTTO jackpot, the fourth highest jackpot in its history. Four winning tickets worth \$17.5 million each were sold in Beverly Hills, Visalia, Glendale and Gardena. The Beverly Hills ticket was bought by

Alyona Praysman; the ticket from Visalia belonged to two sisters, Meryle Gallien and Danielle Estes; the ticket sold in Gardena was won

by four members of the Lee family; and the ticket from Glendale was purchased by a group of 18 Bank of America co-workers. Each of the four retailers who sold a winning ticket received a bonus of \$87,500. Public schools received more than \$32 million from the draw sales for that jackpot.

On June 9, 1999, Lotto Fever again hit California with the third biggest jackpot in California Lottery history. Salvador Gonzalez, the winner of the \$87 million jackpot, became the largest individual prizewinner. Prior to this, the largest individual prizewinner in California Lottery history was Augustine Chiarenza of Lompoc, who won a \$51.6 million jackpot.

Kelly's Mini Mart in Anaheim, the retailer who sold the winning \$87 million ticket, won the largest retailer bonus ever awarded – \$435,000. The owner of Kelly's Mini Mart, Jennifer Lam, said she was "stunned" by the sudden windfall.

## SURPRISE OF A LIFETIME

### Diamond Bar Winner Waits to Check Tickets—and Gets Surprise of a Lifetime

It was mid-March and Mara London was in the middle of her weekly grocery shopping trip. Realizing that the babysitter didn't expect her home for another 30 minutes, she decided to get her SuperLOTTO tickets checked by the clerk. She pulled a handful of tickets out of her wallet and when one didn't come back out of the terminal immediately, the store clerk in Diamond Bar told her she had won a share of a jackpot from January.

London won one third of a \$20 million SuperLOTTO jackpot. Her prize portion was \$6,666,666. The Londons recently closed escrow on a piece of property where, they will build their dream home surrounded by a personal golf course.

## ONLY DAYS TO SPARE

### With 6 Days to Spare, Fullerton Woman Claims \$4 Million Jackpot

Only one winning ticket was sold for the draw on July 15, 1998, but the \$4 million winner had never come forward to claim the ticket. She surfaced nearly six months later and beat the 180-day deadline to claim her SuperLOTTO prize by just six days.

Winner Juanita Sutton finally pulled out a handful of tickets to have them checked at 7-Eleven and found out that one was a winner. She had no idea how much she had won until she came into the Santa Ana District Office to claim her prize.

"When I found out it was \$4 million, I couldn't believe it!" said Sutton.

## DEDICATION PAYS

### 1999 Retailer of the Year

Mr. C's Liquor, located in San Pedro, was named California Lottery's Retailer of the Year. Out of 19,000 Lottery retailers, its commitment to the Lottery and effective promotion of Lottery products earned the store the title of the best Lottery retailer in California in 1999.

Owners Bill and Mary Chan have been residents of San Pedro for 45 years and have owned Mr. C's Liquor for 25 years. The Chans' store is among the 58 lucky retailers who have sold two or more SuperLOTTO jackpot winning tickets. Their first winning jackpot ticket was for \$5.9 million on January 21, 1989. They sold a second winning jackpot ticket worth \$13 million on September 20, 1997.

Known for their dedication to customers, the Chans' total Lottery sales were over \$2.5 million since July of 1996. With a minimum of 34 percent of all Lottery ticket sales going to public education, Mr. C's Liquor has already contributed more than \$860,000 to California's public schools.

## EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION

The Lottery supports various education programs that recognize academic excellence. In 1999, the Lottery sponsored 10 winners of the League of Middle Schools' "Educator of the Year" award.

The Lottery also supported the Principals and Superintendents Academies, which provide specialized training for present and future school principals and administrators.

Two new programs sponsored by the Lottery are the "Teacher of the Year" Award, which is acknowledged as California's highest award for a K-12 instructor, and the "Distinguished Schools" program, which is the cornerstone of the State Department of Education's School Recognition Program.

For the fifth consecutive year, the Lottery sponsored the "Tour of the State Capitol" by the California State Academic Decathlon Championship team. Moorpark High School, 1999 State and National Academic Decathlon Champions, visited both houses of the State Legislature and Gary Hart, Governor Davis's Secretary for Education.

## EDUCATION CONTRIBUTIONS

From its start-up in 1985 through June 30, 1999, the California Lottery contributed over \$10 billion to public education. Total Lottery sales exceeded \$28.8 billion, and \$14.5 billion was awarded to winners as prize money. In the 1998-1999 fiscal year, the Lottery provided 52.5 cents of every revenue dollar to players as prizes, at least 34 cents to public schools, and no more than 13.5 cents for administrative costs. Administrative costs included three cents for game costs, 6.9 cents for retailer commissions, and 3.6 cents for operating expenses.

The \$899 million contributed by the Lottery in the 1998-1999 fiscal year represented approximately two percent of the state's total public education budget, including local, state and federal funding. According to the Lottery Act of 1984, it was the intent of the voters that the net revenues of the Lottery would be used to supplement the total amount of money allocated for public education.

Proposition 98, approved by voters in 1988, constitutionally guarantees a percentage of total General Fund revenues for public schools. Lottery contributions to education are in addition to the General Fund revenues. The Lottery contribution is distributed quarterly to each K-12 school district and to the governing bodies of public colleges and universities based on enrollment, in equal amounts per student.

An interactive retailer section links players to the retailer of the year, to the Lottery's luckiest retailers and to the closest retailer location.

Mr. Rosenberg is a member of the Yolo-Solano Air Quality Management District, the California Council on Criminal Justice Planning, and serves on several other boards.
