### **\$24 Million SuperLotto Plus® Ticket Sold in L.A. County**

**SACRAMENTO** – A *SuperLotto Plus*® ticket sold in Quartz Hill (Los Angeles County) has won a \$24 million prize (less federal taxes). The ticket matched all six winning numbers (30-43-16-37-39, Mega number 14) from Saturday night's draw. The winning ticket was purchased at Super Kwik, located at 4358 West Avenue L in Quartz Hill. We will not know the identity of the winner until he or she claims their prize. The ticket must then also be verified by the California Lottery.

The California Lottery and its employees continue to serve an essential government function, providing supplemental funding to the state's public schools, colleges and universities. The *SuperLotto Plus*® jackpot winner has 180 days from the date of the draw to claim this prize. In order to claim a prize, winners may either mail their winning ticket and claim form, or the winner may elect to drop off their completed claim form and associated ticket to their local CA Lottery District Office location via a secured drop box system. In addition to supporting public education, the Lottery also provides essential revenue to the local retailers that sell tickets. Based on sales levels during late March/early April of this year, retailers across the state received over \$7 million per week in commissions and bonuses from the Lottery. This money directly helps local businesses – most of which are independently-owned by entrepreneurs trying to stay afloat during these difficult times. Super Kwik will receive an estimated \$120,000 in commission for selling the winning ticket.

Super Kwik owner, Mike Maida, says his sales have gone up tremendously over the past couple years, but this is the first winning jackpot ticket he has sold. When asked what he will do with the \$120,000 bonus, Maida says, "We haven't decided what we will do with the money yet, probably upgrade the store".

*The California Lottery's mission is to provide supplemental funding to California public schools, including kindergarten and grades 1-12, community colleges, the California State University, the University of California, and other California public educational entities. The funds the Lottery transfers to public education total approximately \$1.8 billion for fiscal year 2018-19, which amounts to a modest percentage of education's overall budget. However, this funding is largely non-discretionary, meaning schools can use this for important, yet unfunded instructional programs they would otherwise not afford. During the same period the Lottery generated almost \$7 billion in sales, more than 95% of which goes back to the community in the form of prize payments, retailer commissions and bonuses, and contributions to education.
