**Romeo Quinto Jr.** won the \$5 million top prize on the *Luck Scratchers* ticket. He actually went to the Fallon Gate Chevron located at 2760 Dublin Boulevard in **Dublin (Alameda County)** for a car wash, but the line was too busy so he decided to get a drink and a *Scratchers* ticket instead. Good thinking Romeo! He plans to pay off debt, help others and invest his prize.

**Jai McLin** won \$2 million on the *Instant Prize Crossword Scratchers* ticket. He bought the ticket at Oakland Liquor & Market located at 1335 17<sup>th</sup> Street in **Oakland (Alameda County)**.

**Hue Tiet** is \$1.2 million richer after playing a *Set For Life Scratchers* ticket he bought at Jackson Pure Water located at 301 North Jackson Avenue, #7B in **San Jose (Santa Clara County)**.

Players from the Central Valley are also celebrating this summer with big wins. **Francisco Rocha Jr.** won the \$1 million top prize playing the *Million Dollar Multiplier Scratchers* ticket. That winning ticket was purchased at Pic N Go II located at 138 North Maple Avenue in **Fresno (Fresno County)**. Rocha, a college student, was only in Fresno to celebrate a family member's birthday, but he's the one who got the big gift! Rocha plans to put a down payment on a house, buy a car, pay for college and invest!

Two players won \$5 million on *Scratchers* tickets. One of the players is **Jebr Alfarah**, who played the *2021 Scratchers* ticket that he purchased at Sierra Express Mart located at 508 South Mirage Avenue in **Lindsay (Tulare County)**. The other \$5 million winner, **Michael Snyder**, won his prize by playing the *100X Scratchers* ticket he bought at 608 Alamo Pintado Road in **Solvang (Santa Barbara County)**.
