Multiple Millionaires Made in CA on Thanksgiving Weekend!

\$38 Million SuperLotto Plus® Jackpot Hit in Santa Clarita

\$1.6 Million Dollar Powerball® Prize in Sacramento

SACRAMENTO – Two multimillion-dollar winning tickets have been sold in California this Thanksgiving weekend – one in Southern California and one in the state’s capital city at one of Sacramento’s luckiest Lottery markets.

The *SuperLotto Plus*® jackpot was hit in Santa Clarita (Los Angeles County) with a prize of \$38 million (less federal taxes). The ticket that matched all six winning numbers (1-11-27-31-36, Mega number 22) was sold at Plum Canyon Shell located at 19161 Skyline Ranch Road. Plum Canyon Shell will receive \$190,000 for selling the winning ticket.

The *SuperLotto Plus* was not the only draw game that won big last night.

In Sacramento, a winning *Powerball*® ticket worth \$1,675,676 was sold at the [often lucky](#) Lichine’s Liquor & Deli at 7107 S. Land Park Drive. The winning ticket matched five numbers in last night’s drawing (8-32-55-64-66), missing only the Mega number (10). Lichine’s will receive more than \$8,000 for selling the winning ticket.

If a person believes they have a winning ticket, they will need to complete a California Lottery claim form. Claim forms are available on the CA Lottery [website](#), at all Lottery District Offices, and at any of our more than 23,000 Lottery retailers throughout the state. Winners should sign the back of their ticket in ink, make a copy of the front and back, and put it in a safe place until they can claim their prize.

The California Lottery will not know the identity of the winners until the prizes are claimed.

The California Lottery's mission is to provide supplemental funding to California public schools, including kindergarten and grades 1-12, community colleges, the California State University, the University of California, and other California public educational entities. The funds the Lottery transferred to public education totaled more than \$1.8 billion for fiscal year 2020-21, which amounted to a modest percentage of education's overall budget. However, this funding is largely nondiscretionary, meaning schools can use this for important, yet unfunded instructional programs they would otherwise not afford. During the same period, the Lottery generated almost \$8.4 billion in sales, more than 95% of which went back to the community in the form of prize payments, retailer commissions and bonuses, and contributions to education.
