A Powerball® Ticket Worth \$1.4 Million Was Sold in Southern California!

SACRAMENTO – Hitting the jackpot is not the only way to win big in California. Someone bought a Powerball ticket in Los Angeles County and won \$1,417,623 in Saturday night's draw.

The ticket matched five of the six winning numbers (6-12-20-27-32), missing only the red Powerball number (4). The ticket was sold at United Oil located at 1118 N. Glendale Avenue in Glendale, CA. The California Lottery will not know the identity of the winner or winners until they <u>claim their prize</u>. The winner or winners have up to 180 days from the date of the draw to claim this prize.

There were 102,484 winning tickets in California at varying prize levels. See how the winners and prizes break down on <u>our website</u>. Since the jackpot was not hit, the estimated new jackpot for Monday night's draw rolls to \$346 million!

Californians can purchase Powerball tickets for Monday night's draw at any of the more than <u>23,000</u> <u>locations</u> that sell California Lottery games throughout the state. The draw takes place at 7:59 p.m. Pacific Time. The odds of winning any prize in Powerball are 1 in 24.87.
