## \$6+ Million Powerball® Ticket Sold at Riverside County Donut Shop

**SACRAMENTO** – A ticket now worth \$6,021,023 after last night's Powerball draw was sold at a donut shop in Riverside County! Someone bought the ticket at Sunny Donut located at 12636 Limonite Avenue #1C in Corona. The ticket matched five numbers in last night's drawing, missing only the Powerball number. The winning numbers were 41-56-63-11-57 and Powerball number 2.

Known for their delicious donuts and decadent pastries, Sunny Donut caters to early morning customers, many of whom are Lottery players. The donut store will receive a \$30,000 bonus for selling the winning ticket.

The Powerball jackpot for last night's draw was \$168 million, and since there were no tickets sold anywhere in the country with all six numbers, the jackpot for this Saturday's draw is an estimated \$184 million. The odds of matching all five numbers and the Powerball number are 1 in more than 292 million. The overall chance of winning any prize, however, is only 1 in about 25.

The California Lottery will not know the identity of the winner or winners until they claim their prize. They have up to 180 days from the date of the draw to claim this prize.

The California Lottery's mission is to provide supplemental funding to California public schools, including kindergarten and grades 1-12, community colleges, the California State University, the University of California, and other California public educational entities. The funds the Lottery transferred to public education totaled more than \$1.8 billion for fiscal year 2020-21, which amounted to a modest percentage of education's overall budget.
