Powerball® Jackpot Hits an Estimated Half a Billion Dollars!

SACRAMENTO – Here we roll again! Fresh off the record-setting \$2.04 billion Powerball jackpot that a single winning ticket sold in Southern California hit just two and a half months ago, the Powerball jackpot is once again growing – estimated to be \$502 million for tonight's draw.

It was also just ten days ago that a single ticket sold in Maine hit the big \$1.35 billion Mega Millions jackpot.

Here is everything you need to know about this latest massive jackpot:

- The lump sum amount also known as the cash value should a single ticket hit the jackpot tonight is estimated to be \$271.1 million. If more than one ticket matches all six numbers, the jackpot is split.
- Public education in California is winning again; California Lottery has already raised approximately \$34.4 million just from this two-month Powerball sequence alone.
- The last time the Powerball jackpot was hit was when a lucky ticket purchased in Kansas won a \$92.9 million jackpot on November 19, 2022.

The deadline to buy Powerball tickets for tonight's draw is 7 p.m. The draw is slated to happen at 7:59 p.m. PT.
