\$2.6 Million Powerball® Ticket Sold in Stockton!

No One Wins Jackpot, Monday's Prize Currently \$650 Million

SACRAMENTO – Another California Lottery player is having a great weekend after they matched five out of six numbers and won \$2,680,384. The ticket was sold in Stockton (San Joaquin County) for last night's draw at Quik Stop, located at 4707 Quail Lake Drive, Suite 400. The ticket matched the numbers **24-7-32-23-43**, missing just the Powerball 18.

No one in any state won last night's Powerball jackpot, so that means that Monday's jackpot is now an estimated \$650 million. Californians have more than [23,000 options for where to buy their tickets](#). Powerball draws take place Mondays, Wednesday and Saturdays at 8 p.m. PT. Players must buy their tickets before 7 p.m. on the day of the draw in order to be included. Any tickets purchased after 7 p.m. would be eligible for the following draw. The California Lottery's mission is to provide supplemental funding to California public schools, including kindergarten and grades 1-12, community colleges, the California State University, the University of California, and other California public educational entities. The funds the Lottery transferred to public education totaled approximately \$2 billion for fiscal year 2021-22, which amounted to a modest percentage of education's overall budget. However, this funding is largely discretionary, meaning schools can use this for important, yet unfunded instructional programs they would otherwise not afford. During the same period, the Lottery generated more than \$8.8 billion in sales, more than 95% of which went back to the community in the form of prize payments, retailer commissions and bonuses, and contributions to education.
