## No Joke: Powerbal/® Jackpot Jumps to \$1 BILLION as CA Lottery Names Two More Big Winners

SACRAMENTO - This is not an April Fool's Day Powerball prank - tonight's jackpot really is now estimated at a staggering $\$ 1$ billion, and if no one hits it, it'll roll to a projected $\$ 1.09$ billion for Wednesday.

The Powerball jackpot has been inching closer to a billion bucks since it was last hit on New Year's Day. Tonight's will be the $39^{\text {th }}$ drawing in the sequence. Powerball's longest stretch without a jackpot winner is 41 straight drawings, which has happened twice - both ending with single jackpot-winning tickets sold in California:

- November 22, 2022 - $\$ 2.04$ billion winning ticket sold in Altadena
- October 4, 2021 - $\$ 699.8$ million winning ticket sold in Morro Bay

The current Powerball sequence bodes well for California's public schools. From every ticket sold here, approximately 80 cents helps schools earn supplemental funding. Just in the past three months since this giant jackpot has been growing, California Lottery estimates it has raised an additional $\$ 70.5$ million for public education just from Powerball sales alone.

Meantime, the California Lottery is also today announcing the names of two recent big Powerball winners, both of whom have now come forward. Both matched five correct numbers to win more than a million dollars each - not bad for a couple of second-place prizes.

First, Jainimar Ramones Aponte won more than $\$ 1.2$ million in the October 4 Powerball drawing. That winning ticket came from the Walmart on Elk Grove Boulevard in Elk Grove.

A little more than a month later, Enrique Montenegro also won more than $\$ 1.2$ million in the November 22 Powerball drawing. His ticket came from the Stater Bros. Market at 43396 Florida Ave. in Hemet.

If one person wins tonight's top prize, they'll have the choice of taking the final jackpot total in 30 annual payments, or they can take the lump sum cash value, which is currently estimated to be $\$ 483.8$ million.
