

Good Intuition Leads to Incredible Drive Home for Scratchers® Player Who Surprised Family With a Fortune!

Plus, Four More Winners Join the California Lottery Millionaires Club

SACRAMENTO – It started as a routine drive home from the office for **Nora Hammersteadt** until something inside prompted her to stop at an Orange County liquor store and buy a few

California Lottery games. She walked back to her car with ten million reasons why it's lucky she did!



That quick stop at Anaheim Liquor earned her \$10 million, the top prize on a *Royal Riches* game.

"I was thinking 'this can't be real, I must be dreaming!' I'm going to pinch myself and wake up one of these days," Hammersteadt said. She also said she won \$100 on another game she bought.

Instead of being able to head straight to a California Lottery office to claim her prize, she waited a whole week of what she described as "torture" at work before she had the time to turn in her valuable winning ticket.

"It was crazy that week; I was just in a daze. One of the hardest parts was I had to keep it a secret. I couldn't tell anyone because you know how people talk," Hammersteadt said with a laugh. Now she can laugh all the way to the bank.





"It really got real when I turned it in at the Lottery office. That's when it was excitement time and realized retirement is coming two years sooner than I had planned,' Hammersteadt said.

Anaheim Liquor won as well, earning a \$50,000 bonus for selling the lucky ticket.

Ogonna Onyeje is also in a celebratory mood after turning a \$20 investment into the \$2 million top prize on an *Instant Prize Crossword* Scratchers game from the Shop-N-Go in Fresno.

"I play regularly, and I just stumbled upon a lucky one," Onyeje told the California Lottery. "From time to time, you hear of someone winning big, and I kept believing it would be my time someday. It finally happened!"

The Shop-N-Go ownership earned a \$10,000 bonus for selling Onyeje his seven-figure prize.

Jose Reyes Ayala also hit it rich on a \$10 *Instant Prize Crossword*. His \$2 million-winning game was sold at MD Liquor & Food in Santa Rosa, which is also receiving a \$10,000 bonus.

Marilu Munoz Valazquez has an extra \$2 million after winning the top prize on a *Multiplier Craze* Scratchers from the Marathon gas station in Stanton.

Blandina Carranza wraps up the newest list of California Lottery millionaires after winning the \$1 million top prize on a *Power 10's Scratchers*. This lucky game was sold at Bard Market in Oxnard.
