\$2.4 Million Powerball® Ticket Sold in Southern California

SACRAMENTO – While no one in any state hit the giant jackpot in the Saturday night *Powerball* draw, one lucky ticket sold in the Sun Valley neighborhood of Los Angeles earned a \$2.4 million prize for second place. The winning numbers are 6, 23, 25, 34, 51, and 3. The lucky multimillion-dollar ticket, sold at the 7-Eleven near the corner of Roscoe Blvd and Whitsett Ave, missed the jackpot by just one number.

The <u>Powerball</u> top prize has now rolled to a projected \$800 million for Monday night's draw, which will be the 36th draw in the sequence that started the first week of 2024. With the prize pot growing for nearly three full months now, California Lottery has been able to raise an **additional \$53.5 million for <u>public schools</u>** just from sales of this game alone.

Powerball draws three times a week on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays. The odds of winning the jackpot are about 1 in more than 292,000,000, but there are nine ways to win, and the odds of winning at any prize level are about 1 in 25.
