## Routine Errands Lead to Lucky Million-Dollar Win as CA Lottery Players Scratch Their Way to \$21 Million in Prizes

**SACRAMENTO** – Three lucky California Lottery Scratchers® players are enjoying their summer with newfound riches, including one person who was simply running routine errands when something truly out of the ordinary happened.



**Saul Montero** stopped by Prime Liquor Mart in Whittier and became an instant millionaire after purchasing a *Multiplier Craze* Scratchers game. Montero uncovered the top prize, earning him an incredible \$1,000,000.

"It was a pretty impressive moment. I wasn't expecting that," Montero said. "The lucky number was eight. I saw the zeros and thought I might have won \$100. I've never won anything large like that. It took a minute for it to really settle in."

Montero says his million-dollar windfall will go toward paying off a house and maybe even toward a new car.

In Dublin, **Janet Coppedge** secured a massive \$10,000,000 top prize playing a *California 200X* Scratchers. Coppedge bought her winning ticket at A&A Gas and Food Mart.

Meanwhile, in Costa Mesa, **Phong Nguyen** also hit the top prize of \$10,000,000 with a *Super Bonus* Scratchers from Manneh's Alta Dena Dairy.
