

SACRAMENTO – As he walked out of Koko's Liquor in Los Angeles with his winning *Winter Magic Multiplier* Scratchers game, Jeffry Figueroa had one main thought among lots of

He drove to the California Lottery office in Santa Fe Springs, expecting to claim his prize and go home with a check for \$1,000. Imagine the shock when Lottery staff told him he'd made a significant mistake.

His winning game wasn't worth \$1,000. In his moment of initial excitement, he'd overlooked three zeros and was actually the winner of the game's top prize of \$1,000,000!

"When they told me, I was shaking so much I could barely sign the claim form," he said. "It was so surreal. I still can't believe it!"

Koko's Liquor wins too, collecting a \$5,000 bonus for selling Figueroa his lucky ticket.

In addition to Figueroa, five other players have joined the Lottery's millionaires club to start the new year!

Danny Separzadeh banked \$2 million, thanks to winning the top prize on an *Instant Prize Crossword* game. That winning ticket came from an ampm in Mission Hills.





Joe Alfaro also lucked out on an *Instant Prize Crossword*, winning \$2 million as well. His ticket was sold at Imperial Liquor in Van Nuys.

Emilio Espinoza Lozada won \$1 million playing a *Single Double Triple* Scratchers. He got his ticket at the G&M gas station in Torrance.

Up in Northern California, **Fredi Zunun** just became \$1,000,000 richer after stopping by a 7-Eleven in Mill Valley. Zunun picked up a *\$1M Ultimate Cash!* Scratchers and won the game's top prize.

Rounding out the latest millionaires is **Jaime Boland**. She bought a *Winter Magic Multiplier* Scratchers during a grocery shopping trip at Oliver's Market in Santa Rosa and, like Figueroa, won the top prize of \$1 million.
