For This Lucky Scratchers® Player, Her 40 Years of Play 2nd Chance Bonus Draw Win Is a First

A \$40,000 Grand Prize For Not Throwing Her Scratchers Away

SACRAMENTO – Not every California Lottery player knows about <u>2nd Chance</u>, but for one lucky woman recently, her participation in the program earned her a grand prize of \$40,000 after her initial play didn't win.

Players of *SuperLotto Plus*® and *Fantasy 5* draw games can enter 2nd Chance drawings from the moment they buy their ticket. Scratchers players can enter their non-winning games into 2nd Chance drawings using the <u>California Lottery App</u> or online through their <u>personal</u> California Lottery account.

The California Lottery also offers many promotional bonus drawings, just like the <u>40 Years of Play 2nd Chance Bonus Draw</u> for its recently released *40 Years of Play* games to celebrate 40 years of the California Lottery raising supplemental funding for public education.

An entry in the <u>40 Years of Play 2nd Chance Bonus Draw</u> is how **Heidy Felipe** of Pasadena woke up one day to an email asking her to log in to her California Lottery account for "Important Information."

"When I saw the email, I couldn't believe it," recalls Heidy. "The next day, I went to the Lottery office, where they confirmed it was real, and I was speechless."

When the money came, \$40,000 less federal taxes, Felipe paid off her car and now she's just waiting for her title to arrive.

"I play often," she noted, "but this was my first time winning. It's the best thing that's ever happened to me."

Meber Hawara picked up a \$10,000,000 Super Bonus Scratchers game from Sunrise Liquor & Market in Rancho Cucamonga and hit the top prize.

Rosario Juarez De Callejas took home a sweet \$1 million top prize from the *\$1 Million Ultimate Cash* Scratchers bought from Fresh Donuts in Inglewood.

Marco Carillo cleaned up with his big win at the Corbin Express Wash in Northridge, with a \$1 million top prize from a *Loteria*™ *Grande* Scratchers.

2nd Chance drawing details are available on the California Lottery website at calottery.com/2nd-chance. Weekly regular drawings include \$100,000 in prizes for Scratchers entries, with 32 winners including 2 winners of \$25,000 each; 5 winners of \$15,000 each for SuperLotto Plus entries; and \$42,000 in prizes for Fantasy 5 players, including three winners of \$10,000 each.

The Monopoly 2nd Chance Bonus Draw is open until Wednesday, April 30, and features \$50,000 in prizes including one grand prize winner of \$30,000. Details are available at calottery.com/promotions.
