### Store Manager Helps Player Claim His Prize

**SACRAMENTO** – Today marks the first day of the annual <u>National Lottery Week</u>, and for many players, the journey to their win is something we can celebrate along with them.

Armando Vidal's travels began with a move to the Central Coast from the Bay Area. After moving from Santa Clarita to Santa Maria many years ago, he shared with the California Lottery that an injury left him unemployed and then homeless in 2008. As he worked to restore his living situation, he moved to San Luis Obispo and became a regular Sandy's Deli & Liquor.

One mid-April day, Vidal purchased two <u>Triple Red 777</u> Scratchers at Sandy's. Out of the two games, he originally thought only one was a winner for \$200. To be sure, he brought his Scratchers into the store, so the retailer could scan it as well.

Even after scanning the ticket, he thought he'd only won \$100,000. It wasn't until Vidal was chatting and high-fiving with the store manager, Wilson Samaan, that Samaan asked, "What are you going to do with a million dollars?"

"I was like, huh?" recalls Vidal. "And that's how I found out that I'd won a million dollars."



Samaan helped Vidal by making a road trip with him to the California Lottery office in Fresno, so he could safely claim his windfall.

Now, Armando Vidal is working to secure a place to go home to, with a bed, a couple of dogs, and he also plans invest his winnings to keep the money coming in. <u>After his win went viral in</u> <u>April</u>, Vidal also plans to keep a much lower profile in the future.
