## 20 Years Of Play Pays Off For Scratchers® Player

## Regular Fun in Riverside County Turns Extraordinary For Couple

**SACRAMENTO** – The <u>50X The Cash</u> Scratchers games that **Nicholas Gercis** and his wife had been playing gave them a little taste of what it was like to win.

"We buy Scratchers every week, and we started buying these fifty times ones, and it was doing okay for us," recounted Gercis.

After a couple prizes of "\$100 and stuff," Gercis and his wife were enjoying some time out on the patio when they scratched a much bigger winning ticket.

"It was just, like, you know, just what the heck?!" said Gercis, still reflecting on how unbelievable the win was.

Gercis and his wife go to one of a few 7-Eleven stores in their area each week and buy some Scratchers for fun. They've been playing California Lottery games for 20 years by their account. This time, the 7-Eleven at 12578 Schleisman Road in Eastvale paid off for the lucky pair, with a 50X The Cash top prize of \$1 million.

The Gercis family plans to use their winnings to pay off their house, donate some to the church, and invest the remaining money for a sense of security.

Further north, **Pablo Flores** uncovered the top prize of \$5 million with a *100X* Scratchers purchased from the aptly named Lucky Market at 2419 S. Elm Avenue in Fresno.
