## JACKPOT! Winning Powerball® Ticket Sold in California

## Los Angeles County 7-Eleven Earns Million-Dollar Bonus

**SACRAMENTO** – A quick stop at a 7-Eleven just kicked off a power summer for one lucky California Lottery player. Whoever bought a *Powerball* ticket at the Woodman Avenue 7-Eleven in Arleta for the May 31<sup>st</sup> draw is now holding a piece of paper worth \$204.5 million! They have a year to come forward and claim their prize.

The <u>winning numbers</u> were 1, 29, 37, 56, 68, and the Powerball was 13. Thanks to this big jackpot win, the 7-Eleven also earns the maximum bonus of \$1 million!

This is fourth *Powerball* jackpot win this year, with California Lottery players accounting for two of them:

- January 18, 2025 \$328.5 million Oregon
- March 29, 2025 \$526.5 million California
- April 26, 2025 \$167.3 million Kentucky
- May 31, 2025 \$204.5 million California

Every California Lottery game sold contributes to the Lottery's mission of raising extra money for California's public schools. For every \$2 *Powerball* ticket sold in California, approximately 80 cents goes to education. These funds support a variety of programs across the state. The California Lottery has raised more than \$46 billion for public schools through the responsible sale of its games since 1985. Lottery funding for schools is largely discretionary, so administrators and educators can use Lottery money for instructional programs and services they may not otherwise afford. The California Lottery features eight draw games and dozens of new instant Scratchers games each year. More than 95% of California Lottery sales revenue goes back to the community in the form of prize payments, retailer commissions and bonuses, and contributions to education.
