## MEDIA ADVISORY: Tomorrow, March 17, 2025 California Lottery to Announce Winner of Historic \$1.2+ Billion Mega Millions® Jackpot

**SACRAMENTO** – Tomorrow, on what many consider to be the luckiest day of the year, the California Lottery will be in Cottonwood, California, to announce the sole, very lucky winner of the largest *Mega Millions* jackpot in state history. One winning ticket sold in Shasta County at the Sunshine Food and Gas Circle K matched all six numbers on the December 27<sup>th</sup> draw for a jackpot prize of more than \$1.2 billion.

The winner **will not be present** for the announcement and has respectfully declined the opportunity to do media interviews or appear publicly.

In addition to the announcement of the winner's name, California Lottery leaders will highlight the incredible amount of funds raised for public education as a result of this win. Staff from the Circle K, which received a \$1 million bonus, will also share remarks about this historic win.
