## Lucky Mega Millions® Player Nearly Tossed \$1 Million

Travelling Through California, He Played the Lottery and Almost Said Forget About It

**SACRAMENTO** – As he and his family travelled through California, Joaquin Vaughn Redo stopped at Pavilions on Newport Coast Drive in Newport Beach for some things and casually picked up a *Mega Millions* ticket, too.

"We play *Mega Millions* and *Powerball*<sup>®</sup> when we see the pot's growing or something," said Vauhn Redo. "When the pot's big enough, the whole family gets excited and puts in whatever bites."

This time, travelling got the better of their interest, and the whole family forgot about the game until they came across the ticket two weeks later.

"I was actually kind of going to throw them away, because I said 'I've never won the lottery," Vaughn Redo explained.

He decided to check anyway and then found himself in "a kind of disbelief" that he was looking at the right numbers. He had others read the numbers back to him and confirmed he'd matched 5 numbers in the August 16, 2024 drawing, missing only the Mega number. His nearly tossed ticket was worth \$1,016,356!

## More Million-Dollar Prizes This Month For Scratchers® Players

He's not the only recent recipient of a California Lottery windfall. In fact, lately Scratchers players have been cashing in a storm of big prizes. **Maria Samoy Moines** picked up a *\$100 Million Mega Cash* Scratchers game at Hi Bev Liquor in National City and scratched her way to



\$1 million. Jose Baltazar Campos drew a \$1 million prize from a *LOTERIA*<sup>™</sup> Grande Scratchers game bought at B&K Market on Eucalyptus Avenue in Bellflower. **M. Vansyoc** uncovered \$1 million too, playing *Winter Magic Multiplier* purchased at the Mountain View Safeway on the corner of Miramonte and Cuesta. Jnel Erskine scratched a lucky \$1 million prize playing *Triple Red* 777 picked up from the 7-Eleven in Huntington Beach on the corner W. McFadden Avenue and Goldenwest Street right next to Greer Park. Lastly, **Royer Villatoro** Lopez was also playing *Triple Red* 777 when he revealed a \$1 million prize on his game purchased from Jade Video in Rowland Heights.

All told, that's a little over \$6 million in prizes for players of the California Lottery. Those moments of play contribute to the mission of the California Lottery, providing extra funds for public education across the state. While just under 2% of the entire California education budget, California Lottery funds provide program support, assist programs providing job training, and help schools purchase materials.
