Hey 19! Scratchers® Winner Discovers His New Lucky Number

SACRAMENTO – **Jess Daniels** had a long day of errands that ended with a snack, a skipped nap, and an astonishing win of \$1,000,000 from a *\$100 Million Mega Cash* Scratchers game.

During a pause in his errands, he decided to pick up some Scratchers from Gateway Food & Liquor store in San Jose.

After some grocery shopping, Daniels returned home. He had a snack and sat down, contemplating, "Should I take a nap or scratch these tickets?"

Daniels decided to play. He grabbed a piece of chicken and, joined by his granddaughter as a spectator, began scratching.

"I got to the first ticket, the sister to the winning ticket, and saw number 43; it was twenty bucks. Ok, cool," he said. Next, he moved on to his second \$100 Million Mega Cash Scratchers and applied his unique scratching method.



"I scratch all the winning numbers first, then all the player's numbers. Then I start checking them," Daniels explained. "So I went down the rows, first row—43? Nope. 27? Nope. 16? Nope." Then he moved to the next row.

"OH! I've got number 19! So, I started to scratch it," he continued. Having won \$1,000 before, he initially thought, "Hey, maybe it's \$1,000," as he uncovered the first few zeros. It wasn't until he finished scratching that he realized he had won a \$1 million prize.

"Oh my God, Grandpa! Oh my God!" his granddaughter exclaimed as she



watched him uncover the winning amount. For Jess, however, that moment was just part of a bigger story.

"So, check this out," he said, "It was December 19th, the winning number was number 19, and the matching number was also 19. When I filled out the paperwork, it required a 19-digit number, and on the 19th of February, I received my check. So, number 19 is now my lucky number."

"Needless to say, I didn't get a nap that day," he laughs.

Daniels has been a long-time player, having played since the California Lottery's inception 40 years ago. He recalls winning \$25 in 1986 by uncovering "a gold nugget." He was pleased to learn that California Lottery funds, though only a small part of the overall education budget, are spent in ways he would approve of.
