Jackpot! One SuperLotto Plus® Winner Gets the Goods

Winning Ticket Sold in Cotati Worth \$30 Million

SACRAMENTO – One California Lottery ticket sold in Cotati is now worth \$30 million. The *SuperLotto Plus* ticket matched all six numbers in Wednesday night's draw. Those winning numbers were 3,13, 17, 23, 35, and 24.

The lucky ticket was sold at the 76 gas station and market on Gravenstein Highway, just off Highway 101 in Sonoma County. The shop gets a bonus of \$150,000.

SuperLotto Plus is California's original millionaire-maker and can only be played in the Golden State. The California Lottery won't know who Wednesday night's big winner is until they come forward.

SuperLotto Plus jackpot winners have 180 days from the date of the drawing to claim their prize, making the deadline for this prize September 1, 2025. Claim forms are available on the <u>California Lottery website</u>. Players can also pick up a claim form at any of the more than 23,000 California Lottery <u>retail partner locations</u>.

The California Lottery does not announce the names of winners until after they've been vetted by law enforcement, declared the rightful winner, and received their official prize payment. The last time a *SuperLotto Plus* jackpot was hit was back in December, with a winner yet to be revealed.

Three other players may have missed out on millions, but their tickets are still worth a respectable \$11,609 each. Those tickets were sold at Fast Mart on Snyder Lane in Rohnert Park, McNeece Mart on Main Street in El Centro, and the Chevron at 4300 Madison Avenue in Sacramento.

The odds of hitting the SuperLotto Plus jackpot are 1 in 41,416,353; the odds of winning at any of the nine prize levels are just 1 in 23. There were more than <u>97,000 winning tickets</u> in Wednesday's draw.



SuperLotto Plus is just \$1 to play, and from every ticket sold, approximately 40 cents goes toward supplementing budgets for public schools, which is the sole mission of the California Lottery.
