\$50 Million SuperLotto Plus® Jackpot Win in Westlake Village!

Chula Vista & Primm Valley Players Win \$20,000+ Each

SACRAMENTO – One lucky California Lottery player is waking up \$50 million richer this morning after matching all six numbers in Saturday night's *SuperLotto Plus* draw. The winning numbers were 3, 13, 27, 32, 39, and Mega Number 4. The jackpot-winning ticket was sold at the Village Spirit Shoppe in Westlake Village, at 4601 Lakeview Canyon Road. That retailer will receive a \$250,000 bonus from the California Lottery just for selling the winning ticket.

Two other tickets matched five numbers, missing only the Mega number. Those tickets are worth \$20,938 each. One was the Albertsons at 720 3rd Avenue in Chula Vista, and the other winner picked up their ticket from Primm Valley Lotto off Interstate 15 in Nipton.

This is the largest *SuperLotto Plus* jackpot hit so far in 2025, and the first time the top prize has been won since March 5, when a \$30 million [ticket was sold in Cotati](#). *SuperLotto Plus* jackpot winners have 180 days from the date of the draw to claim their prize. Claim forms are available at any of the Lottery's more than 23,000 retail partner locations or online at calottery.com/claim-a-prize.

[SuperLotto Plus](#) is California's original in-state jackpot game. Tickets cost just \$1, and draws happen every Wednesday and Saturday after draw entry closes at 7:45 p.m. PT. The odds of hitting the jackpot are 1 in 41,416,353, but the odds of winning at any prize level are just 1 in 23.
