Sweet Summer Win at Florence Donut Shop

California Lottery Player Scores \$1 Million Prize Scratchers® Ticket

SACRAMENTO – Holding a winning lottery ticket is always a treat, but for one lucky player in Los Angeles, that treat came with a side of donuts. A customer who stopped at Florence Donut Shop at 1242 E. Florence Avenue picked up a Scratchers® game and uncovered a \$1 million prize. The quaint, family-run donut shop is a neighborhood favorite, known for its classic donuts, kolaches, sandwiches, and breakfast items. Now they might add “million-dollar luck” to their menu?

Over \$27 Million in Wins in the State

Being the holder of a million-dollar prize isn't unique to donut-lovers this year.

The winner of one of the largest recent California Lottery prizes is **Luis Briseno**, who won the top prize of \$10 million from a [Royal Riches Scratchers](#). His regal ticket was purchased from Fruitvale Bottles & Liquor at 3715 International Blvd in Oakland. At the time of this release, only one \$10 million prize remains to be uncovered.

Joining in the sweet surprises, both **Catalina Velasco** and **Kanokkorn Sangjun** had [Double the Luck Scratchers](#) lucky scratches worth \$5 million each! Sangjun's *Double the Luck* was purchased from the Mega Nadee Liquor Store at 863 Vermont Avenue in Los Angeles, and Velasco's was picked up from the ARCO am/pm store at 43500 Grimmer Blvd in Fremont.

Tecla Small played a [Show Me \\$5,000,000! Scratchers](#) game that lived up to its name, showing her its \$5 million top prize. Her revealing purchase came from the Safeway at 5450 Dewey Drive in Fair Oaks.

Not to be left out is **Robert Trevino** with a \$2,201,920 win on a [Mega Millions](#)® ticket from the May 9, 2025 draw. Trevino's ticket matched 5 of the winning numbers, 9, 10, 12, 48, and 60, missing only the gold Mega Ball, 16. His game was picked up from the Chevron at 12345 Ramona Avenue in Chino.

A Second Chance to Win

Not every Scratchers ticket is a winner the first time around but with the California Lottery's [2nd Chance program](#), players still have another chance at cash and prizes. By entering non-winning Scratchers into 2nd Chance drawings through the official [California Lottery App](#) or a [registered Lottery account online](#), players are automatically included in weekly drawings. In addition, [special promotional drawings](#), like the current [Game Day 2nd Chance Bonus Draw](#), continuing through October 1, 2025, are held throughout the year. By entering 2nd Chance with any non-winning [San Francisco 49ers](#), [Los Angeles Chargers](#), or [Los Angeles Rams](#) Scratchers, players will automatically be entered into the Game Day 2nd Chance Bonus Draw.
