Powerball® Millionaire Maker Sold In Calabasas

Ticket Matching Five Numbers Sold at Local Gas Station

SACRAMENTO – A *Powerball* ticket matching five numbers was sold at a gas station in Calabasas and is worth \$2,242,838.

The winning ticket was sold at Shell station located at 22295 Mulholland Hwy, just off Freedom Drive in Calabasas, and matched five of the six numbers drawn on Saturday, April 11: 6, 47, 49, 53 and 60, missing only the *Powerball* number, 6.

Once the winner comes forward, they must through the [standard claims process](#). The process to verify the win takes about 6-8 weeks.

Powerball drawings are held every Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday at 7:59 p.m. PT. Entries close at 7 p.m. on the day of each draw. Tickets purchased after that deadline apply to the next drawing.
