Meet Three California Lottery Players With More Than \$65 Million in Wins Between Them

From the Inland Empire to the Bay Area, Lucky Players Win Big Powerball® and SuperLotto Plus® Prizes

SACRAMENTO – Three major wins for these California Lottery players totaling more than \$65 million turn ordinary ticket purchases into memorable moments.

Juan Hernandez Lara may not have hit the jackpot in Ontario, but he still had a 5-number match worth \$1,165,399, missing the jackpot by only the Powerball number. The winning ticket was purchased at Ontario Liquor, located at 1403 E. 4th St., in Ontario. He [joined four other winners](#) who also had 5-number matches and won the same prize amount.

In Westlake Village, **James Bogan** scored the largest prize of the group, a remarkable \$50 million *SuperLotto Plus* jackpot. Bogan's ticket was sold by [Village Spirit Shoppe](#), located at 4601 Lakeview Canyon Road.

Dorothy Fonyonga came away a big winner with a *SuperLotto Plus* jackpot worth \$14 million. The winning game was sold by Maple Leaf Liquors, located at 1146 Saratoga Ave, San Jose.

SuperLotto Plus draws take place Wednesdays and Saturdays at 7:57 p.m., after the draw entry closes at 7:45 p.m. Tonight's drawing will be for an estimated \$31 million. *Powerball* draws take place on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays at 7:59 p.m., and the entry must be made by 7 p.m. Tonight's Powerball jackpot is for an estimated \$218 million.
