In Southern California, another lucky player matched all six numbers to win \$10 million in the [SuperLotto Plus](#) drawing on Saturday, March 14.

The winning numbers were 10,15,16,21,33 and Mega number 6. The ticket was sold at A&J Happy Liquor, located at 414 W. Lincoln Avenue in Orange County.

The *SuperLotto Plus* jackpot reset to \$7 million for the next drawing, scheduled for tonight, March 18. *SuperLotto Plus* draws Wednesdays and Saturdays at 7:57 p.m., after draw entry closes at 7:45 p.m.

More than 95% of California Lottery sales revenue goes back to the community in the form of prize payments, [retailer commissions and bonuses](#), and contributions to education.
