### ***SuperLotto Plus® Jackpot Ticket Sold in Upland***

#### *Lucky Ticket Purchased at Circle K in San Bernardino County*

**SACRAMENTO** – One lucky California Lottery player is now a multi-millionaire after purchasing a winning \$32 million [SuperLotto Plus](#) jackpot ticket in Southern California.

The jackpot-winning ticket matching all six numbers was sold by the Circle K at 681 E. Foothill Blvd in Upland, which is about 40 miles east of Los Angeles. The winning numbers were 8, 11, 22, 37 and 46 with the Mega number 24.

The retailer will receive a bonus for selling the ticket of \$160,000.

#### ***Who Is The Winner?***

The winner must still come forward to begin [the claims process](#). As with all major California Lottery prizes, the claim will undergo a vetting process to ensure the legitimacy of the win. This process typically takes six to eight weeks to complete. The California Lottery reminds players to sign the back of their ticket and keep it in a safe place until they have claimed their prize.
